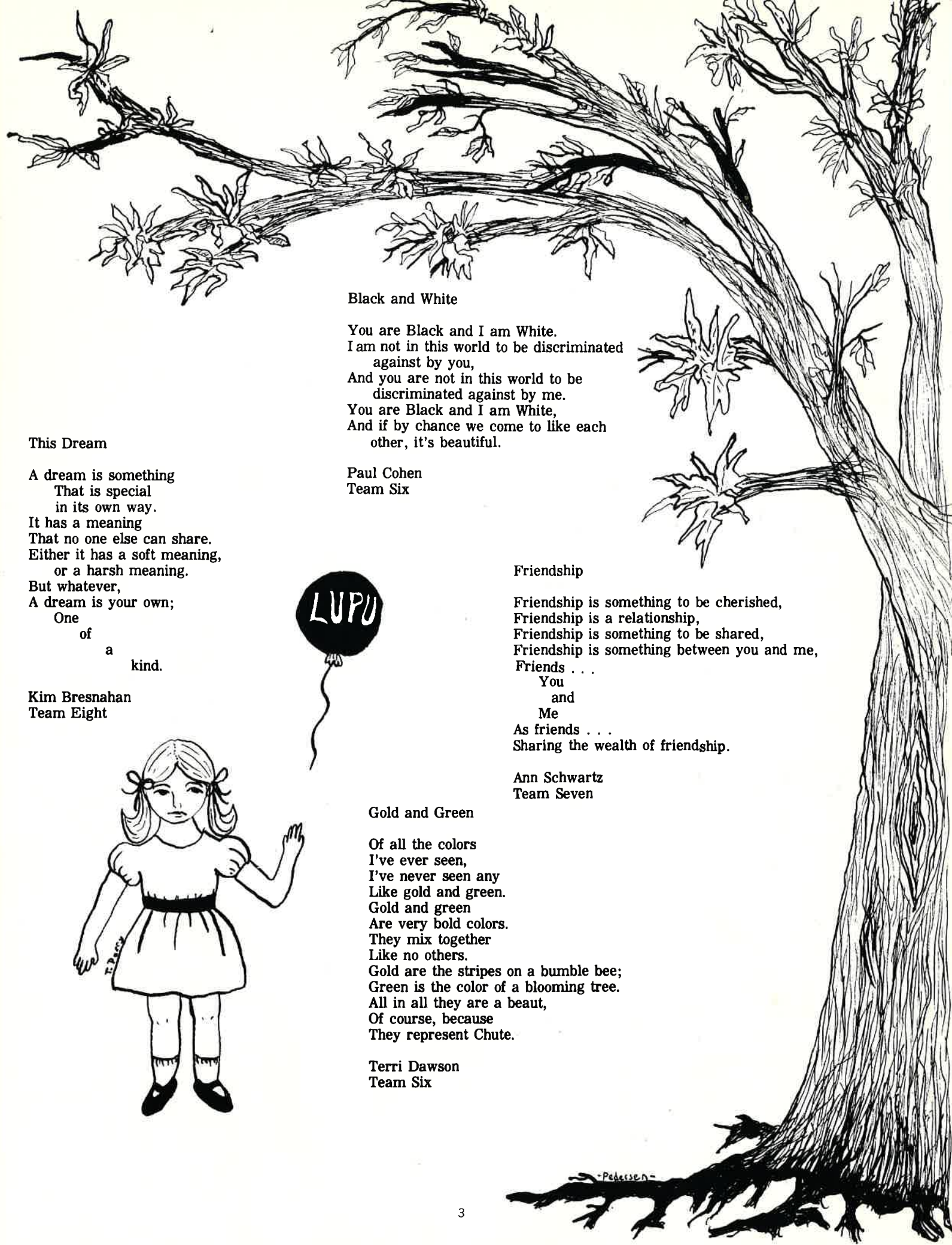
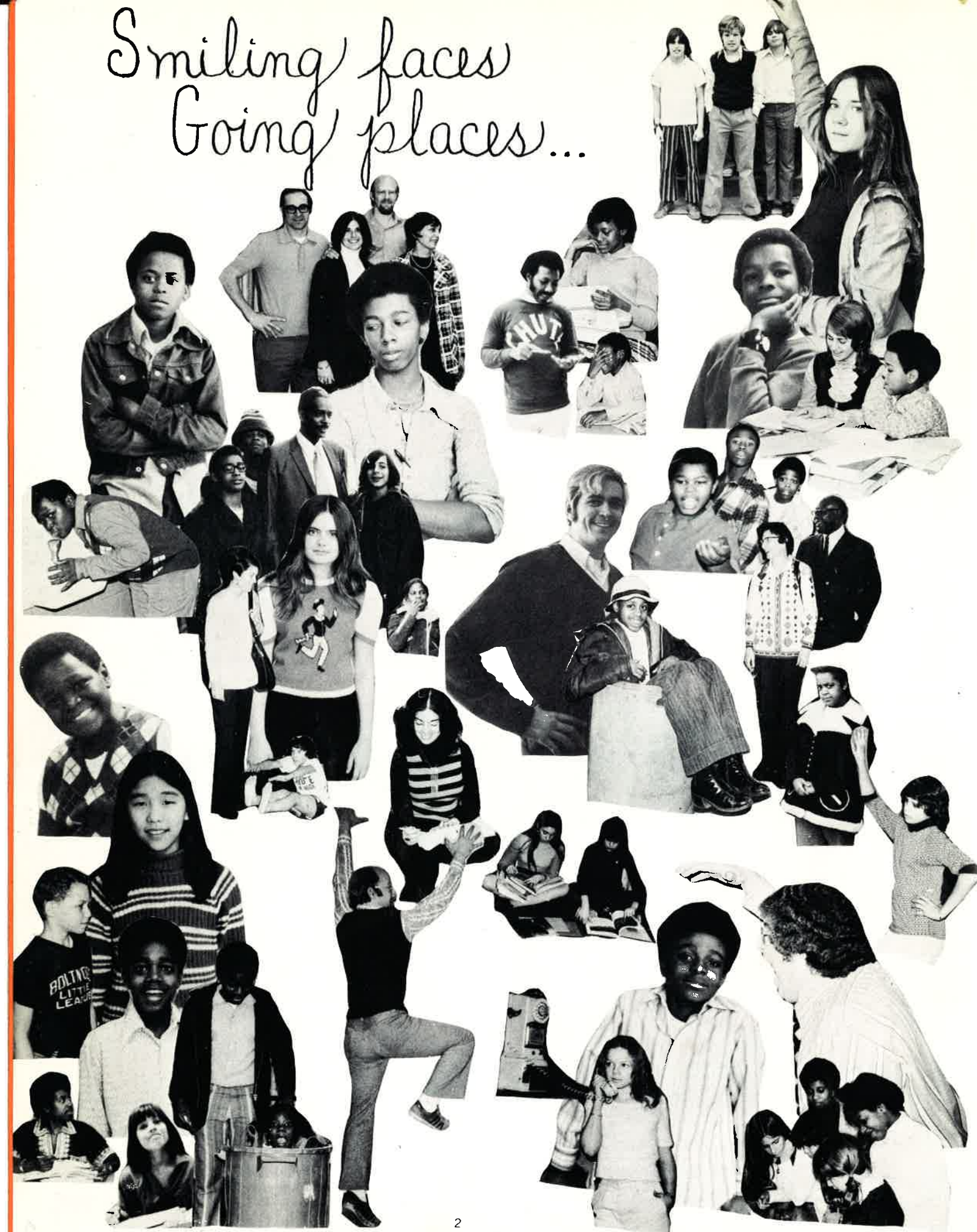

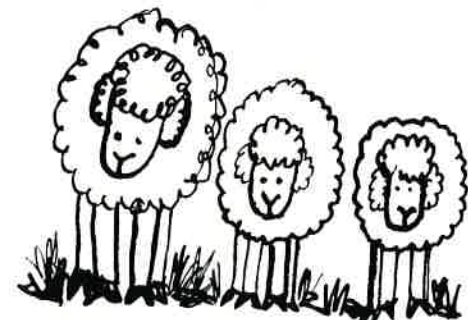
The Beauty of Spring

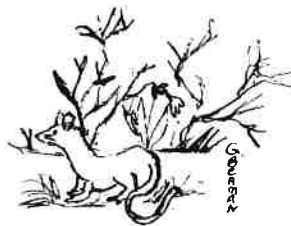

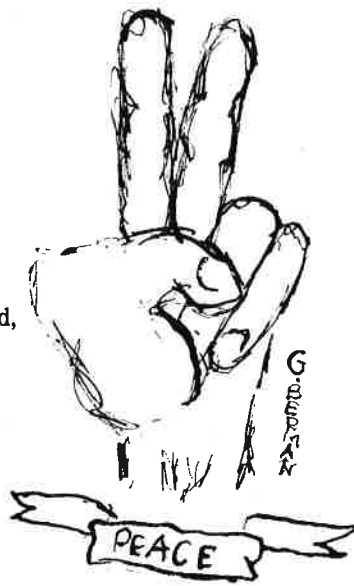
I heard the trumpets roaring;
